Fast times

hen Dane Skeete and Tyler Mayhew won Sol Rally Barbados 2022, their second win after RB19, they carved a fifth notch on the workshop door of the Subaru Impreza WRC S12 in which Skeete's father Roger clocked up the last three of his 13 victories in the island's premier event. Should they prevail again this year, it would become the most successful car in the event's 33-year history, eclipsing the record of the Peugeot 205 GTi in which 'The Sheriff' claimed the first five between 1990 and '95.



Many factors will dictate the outcome for the only remaining crew in the island's WRC class, not least the high quality entry from home and overseas: FIA Rookie of the Year in 2022 and already a podium finisher in Formula 2 this year, Barbadian Zane Maloney – the youngest winner of King of the Hill, aged 18, in 2022 – plus first-timers New Zealander Hayden Paddon, current leader of the European Rally Championship, and former British Rallycross Champion Ollie O'Donovan join five-time winner Jeff Panton of Jamaica, Josh Read – second overall last year in his first Rally Barbados in the FIA R5 class - and UK visitors Roger Duckworth, Andy Scott and Rob Swann, all of them podium finishers in the recent past.

While the FIA R5 class continues to grow steadily, it has so far only produced one Rally Barbados winner, the late American motor sport icon Ken Block, whose victory with Alex Gelsomino in 2020 came in an event postponed by the coronavirus pandemic and run in November, with seasonal weather playing its part. Not only did his presence lift the mood after many months of trauma, but his huge social media footprint brought valuable coverage for our event and for an island he loved. He is sorely missed here.

Let's deal first with the three overseas WRC cars, all returnees: former rallycross rivals Kevin Procter and Scott each have a Ford Fiesta S2000T. With 11 top 10 finishes in 15 visits - fourth four times, including RB22 - fan favourite Procter is chasing an elusive podium finish, which looked on in Sol RB19 until his gearbox let go on Saturday's final stage, when he was running second with 2019 British Rally Champion Co-driver Patrick Walsh, who is also back. Scott, the 2009 Open Rallycross Champion and twice British Rallycross Vice-Champion, was third in Sol RB19, also winning the FIA R5 class, with fellow Scot Laura Connell, who returns with him this year.

While they may not be fighting for the class win, former Scottish Rally Championship class-winner Fraser Louden, back for the fifth time, and Ashleigh Will are aiming to avoid a repeat of Sol RB20, when his 100 per cent finishing record looked safe until one corner from home, when he struck the Vaucluse Raceway chicane in his Mitsubishi Lancer Evo Proto, losing what would have been his highest overall finish, 11th...

The growing number of R5 and Rally2 cars in the island gave birth to the 2022 R5 Rally Championship presented by First Citizens, administered by the Barbados Motoring Federation (BMF) as the country's first-ever national championship. Leading after round one of season two, April's Shakedown Stages, last year's Champion Stuart Maloney (Skoda Fabia Rally2 evo) is set on beating Skeete's WRC Subaru in Sol RB23. In identical Fabias are his brother Mark, a podium finisher in the island's premier event in 2001, co-driven by son Justin, also nephew Zane; Stuart and Zane have the experienced Yearwood brothers, Kristian and Kreigg as co-drivers.

With long-term co-drivers Mike Fennell Jnr and Darren Garrod respectively, Panton and Swann have supported island motor sport for many years, both former BRC 4wd Champions; their 2022 campaigns were less rewarding, Panton failing to complete the season and Swann's best result third in Sol RB22, a fourth podium in five events, so they have swapped Fiestas for Fabias. Panton has a new Fabia Rally2 evo, while Swann has the R5 first rallied here by Brit Tom Preston (ninth and Group A winner, Sol RB18), then Stuart, then Zane Maloney last year, before Suleman Esuf and now Swann.

Also Skoda-mounted is Roger Hill, who finished third in the R5 standings last year, losing out on a tie-break to Read, despite having contested every round; Hill has more than 20 top 10 finishes in the island's premier event to his credit, most of them with Graham Gittens, so can never to be discounted. The remaining local and regional R5s are all Fiestas: while Read's class victory and second overall was impressive, as he had only driven the car in anger at First Citizens KotH, it was no surprise as he and Mark Jordan have won many BRC titles. President of the BMF Senator Andrew Mallalieu was the early leader of Sol RB20, finishing fourth and highest-placed local with Geoff Goddard, although FIA duties abroad limit his seat time. Finally, Jamaican all-rounder Kyle Gregg, whose father Gary won RB06, is a title-winner on both racetrack and rally stage; with co-driver Orry Hunte, he made a strong impression in the opening R5 round.

The final Fiesta is former UK National Champion Roger Duckworth, well-known in these parts with his ex-Juha Kankkunen Impreza WRC (henceforth to be used only for show events, such as the Goodwood Festival of Speed). Last year, he was running well until he inverted the car, so returns determined for better, with new co-driver Stuart Loudon, who finished fourth in Sol RB14 in Paul Bourne's Ford Focus WRC06.

Thus far, only Fabias and Fiestas have been seen in R5 in the island, but Turks & Caicos Rally Team member Paul Horton, sixth in the Championship last year, has replaced his Fiesta with a Citroen C3 Rally2, which he used for events in England and Ireland before it shipped. With triple British Rally Champion Matt Edwards as driver coach and co-driver, he has edged steadily closer to the more experienced drivers ahead.

The entries for Paddon and O'Donovan, whose Hyundai i20 R5s will be run by Scott's Albatec Racing outfit, bring a fourth manufacturer to the island scene, albeit temporarily. Multiple New Zealand Champion Paddon won the closed-road Rali Ceredigion in Wales last September in the same car and enters RB23 with his long-term co-driver John Kennard. In 2016, Paddon won Rally Argentina for



Hyundai in, which was his - and New Zealand's - first World Rally Championship win, while co-driver Kennard also became the oldest co-driver to win a WRC round at 57 years of age.

Ticking the island off his 'bucket list' has taken O'Donovan a long time, after a family emergency prevented him from taking up his entry in 1997. He finished second in the UK's 2022-2023 Circuit Rally Championship (driving the car Paddon will use here) but his recent background has been in Rallycross, British Champion in 2007 and a regular title-contender, second in 2016, '20 & '21.His co-driver is England's Jack Morton, who finished third here in 2018 with Paul Bird (Ford Focus WRC07).

As the FIA R5 class grows steadily stronger, so entries in the other 4wd classes have dwindled. This is the second year with no Group N cars, while Modified 4 (sort of old Group A plus a bit), has shrunk again, this time to five entries, but still with a healthy mix of nationalities, very much in the spirit of Sol Rally Barbados. Mark Thompson, a local and regional race and rally champion, and Guyana-born co-driver Kurt Seabra, will not only be at the sharp end of the class, but likely the event overall! They were set for a well-deserved overall podium finish in Sol RB19 when the gearbox of their Mitsubishi Lancer Evo IX gave out three stages from home, then finished an impressive sixth overall last year, splitting the WRC and R5 entries. It'll be an exciting ride . . .

Also in Evos are George Sherman from the US and Scotland's Ian Barclay. Former drag and circuit racer Sherman, whose Evo IX lives in the island (formerly driven by T&T's David Coelho), was BRC Novice of the Year and GpN Champion in 2018 before the car was upgraded to M4, but Covid interrupted any chance of steady development; co-driver T&T's Stuart Pinheiro sits in for the first time. Barclay was the newcomer last year in his Evo VI, finished 29th and second to Thompson, with English-born student son Cameron on the notes. This year, wife Sue Plater co-drives, while Cameron sits with family friend Mick Smith in his historic class Sunbeam Imp.

The unknown in M4 is the new Audi TT-R of island siblings Kyle and Kayleigh Catwell. Started in the UK, this is an exciting project for father Norman's Chicken Pen Racing, which has helped develop many youngsters in island motor sport. Norman and Kyle are former class-winners (VW Golf), also both circuit racers, while Kayleigh is one of the few female kart racers in the island. Finally, Stuart Deeley returns with his Toyota Celica GT4 and family friend Andy Doano, who thought he had ticked Rally Barbados off his bucket list last year . . . but clearly hadn't!

Don't forget, this event is about far more than the battle for overall supremacy, so read on through the following pages for the 2wd and class previews.



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Zane Maloney

Sol Rally Barbados is the first rally of the year for 'The Boy from Barbados'. He will have returned home just days before the event after three back-to-back FIA Formula 2 race weekends at Imola, Monaco and Barcelona, the last of which clashed with First Citizens King of the Hill. All this was after press time for this Programme, before which 19-year-old Zane's best result had been third in Bahrain in the campaign's first weekend.

Hayden Paddon

By the time he arrives in Barbados, the 36-year-old Kiwi will have already contested five major rallies this year: in his first European campaign since 2017, he was leading the 70th Anniversary ERC at press time, winning in Portugal in March, finishing second in the Canary Islands with round three to come in Poland on May 20/21. Back home, he won the opening round of the New Zealand Championship, with the second on May 12/14.

- the Mayers brothers, Barry (2005) and Roger (2016), jointly hold the record for the best overall result since the event was last won by a 2wd car, Roger Skeete's Peugeot 306 S16, in 1997; each finished fourth in a Toyota Starlet
- based on time, however the gap to the winner as a percentage of the winner's time Sean Gill (Suzuki Swift) has the best result, fifth in 2008, just 2.69 per cent behind winner Kris Meeke (Subaru Impreza WRC S9)
- last year was only the third time in 32 years that no 2wd cars finished in the top 10, with Justin Campbell (BMW M3) 14th. The top 2wd placed 12th overall in 2009 (Jonathan Still, BMW M3) and 2019 (Stuart Maloney, Citroen C2)

Safety

Motorsport can be Dangerous!

Please heed the advice and warnings of our Officials, Marshals, Security Personnel and the Barbados Police Service at all times.

Official vehicles:

Safety - check to determine that safety plans have been adhered to, marshals are in place and spectators are standing in safe places

Car 000 - Stage preparation: a final check to ensure spectators are standing in safe places as the stage is about to start. If they are not, and do not heed the requests of officials, the stage will be delayed. A final check that timing equipment is set up and working

Car 00 - Road closed - Stage Live: this car travels at competition speed – when it appears, the stage is live – do not under any circumstances walk on to, or attempt to cross, the stage

Car 0 - Stage live: the 'Zero' car travels at competition speed – when it appears, the stage is live – do not under any circumstances walk on to, or attempt to cross, the stage

Car 999 - Road open: the stage is officially completed – please do not walk or drive onto the course until this vehicle has passed

Parking:

We experience delays in running a rally due to spectator traffic and poor parking.

- please park off the road and do not block roads by parking badly
- please do not park in or obstruct any private driveways or roads
- please do not park at the start or finish of special stages

Finally, please remember other road users and the general public.

Drive slowly, drive carefully

Don't:

- stand on the road
- stand below the level of the road
- stand in front of arrows or signs
- stand or sit on walls or fences
- sit close to the edge of the track
- remove stage signs or arrows

Always:

- expect the unexpected
- listen for approaching cars
- remain alert
- try to keep behind something solid
- keep children under supervision
- do as the marshals ask

DO NOT under any circumstances drive onto, walk onto, or attempt to cross a special stage WHEN IT IS LIVE. There will be competition cars travelling at extremely high speeds. Competition cars and their occupants have a wide range of mandatory safety devices & equipment to protect them - YOU DON'T.



ast year, under the headline 'Changing of the 2wd guard' this preview discussed the very different make-up of the entry for Sol RB22, highlighting significant absenteeism among the potential front-runners and the presence of only one previous winner of the 2wd trophy, one Andrew Jones; finishing 10th overall in Sol RB20, he had claimed 2wd honours for the first time in his SuperModified 2 Ford Escort MkII.

Well, he didn't add to his tally in 2022. 'Jonesy' finished only one stage before an electrical gremlin joined him and co-driver/wife Lindsey Pilkington in the car, while a broken throttle linkage put the next most likely winners Logan Watson and Andrew Croney (BMW M3) out of the running early, too. The leaders from stage two were Chris Ullyett and daughter Chantal in their Escort RS2000, running as high as 18th overall, but they became a dnf, with the trophy eventually claimed by Justin Campbell and Ayrton Bannister, winners of Modified 3 in their M3, described afterwards by the driver as: "the closest feeling I think I could get to winning Sol Rally Barbados."

Fast forward to 2023 and the picture has been adjusted again. While we are still without Watson's brother Rhett (top 2wd in RB14 & '15 in his mighty BMW M3) or Josh Read (now strutting his stuff in a Fiesta R5), many of the regular suspects are back. Brothers Barry and Roger Mayers jointly hold the record for the highest overall finish since the event was last won by a 2wd drive car in 1997, fourth (Roger RB16, Barry RB05), and Barry added to the family's trophy cabinet in 2017 & '18. They are both back in earnest this year, first and second in 2wd in April's Shakedown Stages, Roger's Toyota WR Starlet ahead of Barry's Fiesta, where they were shadowed by Logan Watson, who remains a name to consider in this conversation, his Modified 3 class car edging ever closer to the more modified cars ahead.

Of the other BMWs, it's good to see Sammy Cumberbatch on the entry list for the first time since 2019, when he retired late on Saturday evening, lying 30th overall and sixth in SM2; in RB11, he memorably won what was then SM11 with his late brother Owen finishing second in his M3. 'Bird', who died last year, is remembered with great affection by the motorsport community. Then there's Jonathan Still, top 2wd back in 2009, Mark Kinch who didn't make it to the start-line in 2022 with last-minute teething problems, and of course Campbell, unless he gets bitten by the entertainment bug, something which has affected Ahmed Esuf terminally – while their drifting display in the Shakedown Stages might have raised an eyebrow or two in Rally Control, the fans loved it! Local non-BMWs worth a mention for the 2wd places would include Kurt Thompson's Honda Civic plus two-time BRC Champion Drivers Neil Corbin (Toyota GT86 CS-R3) and Eddie Corbin (Daihatsu Charmant).

It hasn't been often that overseas visitors have fought their way in to the top five of 2wd, Simon Mauger (2nd RB15) and Frank Kelly (3rd RB14) the most successful, but certainly worth a mention this year is Nigel Worswick. Back with his MkII Escort for the first time since 2015 having campaigned both Escort Cosworth and, most recently, Fiesta S2000T in the intervening years, he could well be one to watch. He finished 15th overall and sixth in 2wd in RB14 and the car has not been rallied since a full rebuild during the coronavirus Lockdown . . .































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hree rounds of the Barbados Rally Club (BRC) Driver's and Class Championships are fought out over these two weekends. Visitors from overseas do not affect local driver's points scores, but national pride is at stake, so everyone wants to do their best while flying the flag!

SuperModified 1: there's been a huge explosion of interest in this class, up from three local drivers to eight this year. Last year's BRC Rookie of the Year Darren Lashley (Starlet) and fellow circuit racers Ross Callender and Tremaine Forde-Catwell in Daihatsu Charmants will likely fight over the win, but Fabien Clarke will be there to pick up the pieces in his trusty Suzuki Ignis Sport . . .

M2: double BRC Champion Driver Neil Corbin gave his new Toyota GT86 CS-R3 a winning Rally Barbados debut last year, in the absence of long-term rival Jamal Brathwaite (Honda Civic Type-R) and after early pace-setter Chris Ullyett (Ford Escort RS2000) retired. Sean Corbin and Michael Worme have upgraded their BimmaCup cars, so will likely be in the mix, while the class also plays host to Dwane Jackman with an as-yet-unseen Volkswagen Golf GTI Mk2 and England's Cheryl and Barry Spencer (Vauxhall Astra GSi), celebrating the 15th Anniversary of their Boatyard wedding...

M1: current BRC Champion Driver Eddie Corbin (Daihatsu Charmant) and Jermin Pope (Honda Civic) meet again; both have won rally and circuit racing titles and there is rarely much between them, a battle to savour. Rally Barbados debutant Jamaica's Horatio Brown is settling well into his Citroen C2R2, while always in with a chance of a class podium are Honda Civic regulars Pierre Clarke and Paul Inniss...





Historic 1 & 2: newcomer Ireland's Mick Smith is the lone entry in H1 in his immaculate Sunbeam Imp, built as a replica of the last works rally car, down to the factory Rootes blue livery. In H2, England's Chris Shooter returns with his familiar MkII Escort to take on Barbados-based former Motoring News Road Rally Champion Harold Morley in his Porsche 911 RS. All those cars are worth close inspection at The Rally Show...

Clubman 3: it's hard not to think that Greg Cozier, one of only two local drivers to have driven in all 32 previous events, will prevail here in his BimmaCup Too. That said BMW drivers Kevin Armstrong and Karl Bovell may have other ideas . . .

C2: with 14 BimmaCup cars, this is the biggest class, and with big names, too! While one BimmaCup champ has moved on (Sean Corbin), there are still other title-winners ready to battle it out (Derek Edwards, Ian Warren, Ryan Wood), also Chris Hoad who won C2 in the BRC Championship in 2021. A warm welcome to Stewart Gordon from Antigua, a regular BimmaCup Caribbean competitor, and we must also mention Natya Soodeen, a great champion of Women in Motorsport...

C1: Jason Tull's Peugeot 106 Rallye S2 looks the likely winner here, but perhaps newcomer Wayne Tasker can shake things up with his Opel Corsa...

GpB (not eligible for overall position): Calvin Briggs (Ford Sierra), larger-than-life character Shon Cummins (BMW) and Mark Huggins (Daihatsu Charmant) represent the home team here, with two Brits to challenge them: Martin Stockdale (BMW 1M Coupe) returns from the UK for his 21st attack on the BRC's premier event, Andrew Costin-Hurley (Ford Puma Evo) is back for his 18th, and they are both regular finishers, usually well in to the top 30 . . .



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
